6 Zempukuji Temple



This temple was founded in the Heian Period on a hill by Kukai. Shinran also stayed here in the Kamakura Period. The temple premises are home to many cultural assets including a 700-year-old ginkgo known as "the upside-down tree" that is a National Natural Monument.

8 Arisugawa-no-miya Memorial Park



With an area of approximately 6.7ha, this park served as the suburban residence of the Nanbu Morioka clan. It subsequently became the property of Arisugawanomiya, who gifted it in 1934. This quiet park retains the look and atmosphere of the daimyo's gardens.
