The required time and traveling time of the indicated courses will vary depending on conditions such as the state and physical condition of the person going out, whether the wheelchair is manual or electric, etc. Therefore, please use it only as a reference. In addition, each course may require a helper due to the difficulty of wheelchair control either by a helper or the wheelchair user. (This map was created based on the assumption of an accompanying helper.)

The suggested courses are only examples of our recommendations. Do feel free to plan your routes flexibly according to your mood and the seasons.
