Course Information

A Shiba Course	A historic sightseeing course where you can feel the Edo period
B Shimbashi Course	A course that goes around the areas where the Japanese railway originated
C Azabu Course	A course of historical and traditional Azabu sights
D Roppongi Course	A course where you can experience the arts
E Akasaka Course	A course where you can explore the charms of Akasaka, interwoven with the traditional and the contemporary
F Aoyama Course	A course for experiencing the culture and arts of Aoyama
G Gaien Course	A course that touches on the history of Meiji period
H Takanawa Course	A course that goes around key areas of Takanawa's history, and an aquarium
I Shirokane Course	A course for seeking out relaxation in a rich natural environment, and for nurturing one's sensitivity at Platinum Street
J Konan Course	A course offering enjoyment along the canal waters as well as nature
K Shibaura & Daiba Course	A course exploring tourist attractions in the Bay Area
L Takeshiba Course	Sweeping views of Tokyo Bay: Enjoy the sea breeze, along with the latest that Minato City has to offer
M Arisugawa-no-miya Memorial Park Course	Cherry blossoms, fresh greenery, ginkgo, and even illumination in winter! The Moto-Azabu area walking course lets you enjoy the scenery to the fullest, no matter the season when you visit
N Mita Course	There are libraries, stores, and places to relax along the canal. There is a lot to do on this course while you enjoy the scenery

How to use the map

Filled with helpful information for the elderly and those with children, such as elevators and baby-friendly facilities

This map introduces classic 14 courses connecting popular tourist sites of the Minato City. In creating this map, we used an actual wheelchair to verify the information on the respective sites. In addition to tourist information and barrier-free information for each facility, this map also offers visual images, barriers on the travel routes, barrier-free information, and tips in an easy-to-understand format. The required time and traveling time of the indicated courses will vary depending on conditions such as the state and physical condition of the person going out, whether the wheelchair is manual or electric, etc. Therefore, please use it only as a reference. In addition, each course may require a helper due to the difficulty of wheelchair control either by a helper or the wheelchair user. (This map was created based on the assumption of an accompanying helper.) The suggested courses are only examples of our recommendations. Do feel free to plan your routes flexibly according to your mood and the seasons.

How to interpret the data

A-4 Tokyo Tower

Japan's foremost tourist attraction

The soaring, 333 m tall symbol of Tokyo. This radio tower, with its observation deck, was completed in 1958. Tower lights change depending on the season, with cool lights in summer and warm motifs in winter.

Duration 60 minutes

Moving route (walking - wheelchair)

While the slope path is gentle overall, some sections have a gradient of more than 3°.

Slope Information:

- 3° slope-** A slope that is difficult to self-propel unless the wheelchair user is very experienced, and which places a heavy burden on the helper. For example, a slope that rises about 50cm over a distance of 10m.
- 3° slope** A slope that is easy to self-propel even for inexperienced wheelchair users, and which make light work for helpers.
