Opening of the Minato Children and Families General Support Center in Minami-aoyama

In April 2021, Minato Children and Families General Support Center will open. It will be a multifunctional facility consisting the Children and Families Support Center, Child Consultation Center, and Maternal and Child Living Support Facility. It will further enhance functions to provide support from pregnancy to child-rearing, adolescence, and child independence.

Children and Families Support Center

Center supporting children, families, and expectant mothers. Relocated from the Minato Public Health Center, Mita 1-chome.

It will provide a place where parents raising children can gather and interact with each other, and also providing wide range of consultation services for children and families, including child-rearing advice, assistance for single parents, and domestic violence consultations. Also, a café will be set up to promote exchange.

Child Consultation Center

Child psychologists, doctors, lawyers, etc. will provide consultation services. Also, providing social care services to ensure safe and secure places for children, such as placing children with foster parents and in children's homes.

Consultation Services

Consultation	Consultation content
Childcare	When a child cannot live at home due to the guardian's situation. Abuse and other problems involving children's human rights.
Disabilities	When a child has slow intellectual development, or a physical disability. Obtaining the <i>Ai-no-techo</i> Certificate of the Intellectually Disabilied.
Delinquency	When a child runs away from home, steals, has a drug habit, etc.
Childrearing	Concerns about selfishness, restlessness, difficulty making friends, bullying, tics, etc.
Foster parents	Regarding foster parents and Special Adoption foster parents.

Maternal and Child Living Support Facility

Maison de Ajisai Maternal and Child Living Support Facility is a facility that supports the stable lives and independence of single mothers. Professional staff, related organizations, and the community to provide support for mothers and children

The City will also be responsible for approval of foster parents, authorization of nursery schools, and determination of the presence and degree of intellectual disabilities in order to protect the lives and rights of children.

Resident Support Section Counter Service Hours

Due to the busy relocation season ahead of the new fiscal year, Minato City's Resident Support Section will offer extended service counter operating hours on the first floor of the Shiba Regional Office every Saturday between March 27 and April 3. The counter will be open from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Please note that the extension is not applicable to other Regional City Offices.

All Regional City Offices operate until 7 p.m. every Wednesday, except for Daiba annex and for the period between December 29 and January 3 and national holidays.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

vercoming the VID-19 pandemic

Let's all keep the following seven points in mind.

- 1. Please refrain from leaving home unless necessary, especially after 8 p.m.
- 2. When you take off your mask for a meal, wash your hands with soap or use alcoholic disinfectant before eating. Fold your mask inside and avoid speaking. If you can't keep a distance, hold a fan or similar object in front of your mouth to avoid droplets of saliva from spreading when you talk.
- 3. Each of us should practice new routines*. *Habits that prevent the spread of infection in our daily lives and workplaces in order to overcome the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 4. Wash your hands frequently with soap and use alcoholic disinfectant. Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough.
- 5. Maintain appropriate distance. If you are not wearing a mask, keep a distance of 2 meters.
- 6. Avoid the Three C's: (1) Closed spaces with poor ventilation (2) Crowded spaces with many people nearby (3) Close-contact settings such as close-range
- 7. If you have a fever or other cold symptoms, take a day off from work or school. Check and make a record of your body temperature every day.

Let's make My Number Card

Part 4 My Number Card Security Measures

My Number Card is a secure card you can carry with you and use.

- 1. No one else can use your My Number for any procedures. Your My Number Card has a photograph of your face. When you use your My Number, you must identify yourself with a photo ID, so it is impossible for someone else to impersonate you. In addition, there are severe penalties for misuse of the My Number.
- 2. My Number Card is difficult to forge. Text characters on the card are engraved with a laser and the face of the card is decorated with complex patterns.
- 3. Stealing the information recorded in the IC chip is difficult. IC chip records only the minimum information that is on the front of the card, such as name, address, and date of birth. It does not record information on taxes, pensions, etc. PIN is required to use the card. This PIN is set for digital certificate and application. Moreover, if the PIN is entered incorrectly for couple times, the card will be locked. If someone tries to read the data illegally, the system will automatically delete the recorded information.
- 4. When the card is lost or stolen, you can stop your My Number Card temporarily for anytime.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES

Termination of the Registration for Motorcycles

Owners of light motor vehicles, such as motorcycles, electric bicycles, scooters or mini cars, are subject to a light vehicle tax (category base), which is imposed as of April 1. If for any reason you no longer own a tax-subjected light motor vehicle, please complete the registration termination procedures no later than March 31. If you fail to complete the procedures, you will be required to continue paying taxes in 2021 despite not owning a light motor vehicle.

Completing the procedures

For motorcycles up to 125cc, visit the Counter Services Subsections of Regional City Offices.

Using the Minato City Libraries and the Minato City Local History Museum

Minato City Libraries

Borrowing library materials

You are free to read any books and check out any library material using your library card. Those who live, work or study in Tokyo's 23 cities are eligible to check out materials from municipal libraries. When applying for a library card, please provide an ID that shows your address, company or school address.

Lending limit: 2 weeks

Ten books/magazines, three CDs, two DVDs, three videotapes

Please use the automated lending machine at each library.

Returning library materials

All materials borrowed can be returned to any libraries and cooperating facilities in the city. During closing hours, return them to the book return box. A book return box is located at all libraries, except for the Takanawa Library Annex. Also, there are book return boxes in the Minato City Local History Museum, Lifelong Learning Center, Minato Park Shibaura, and Shibaura-konan Civic center.

Note: CDs, videos, DVD, and materials from Tokyo Metropolitan Library and libraries in other cities cannot be returned in the box. Please return them to the appropriate library counter directly.

Borrowing/returning at cooperating facilities

Items from Minato City libraries can be borrowed and returned to the library at the Minato City Local History Museum, Daiba Civic Center, Gender Equality Center "Libra," and Aoyama Lifelong Learning Center. Please note that the operating hours of each facility will differ from the Minato City libraries.

Collaboration between university libraries in the city

Materials from Temple University Japan Campus library and Tokyo University of Marine Science and Technology library can be borrowed via any Minato City library.

Minato City residents aged 18 and over who have

library cards can browse materials in the Shibaura Institute of Technology Library.
