# **Earnest Wish for World Peace**



Minato City issued the Declaration as a City of Peace on August 15, 1985, calling for the abolition of nuclear weapons and permanent world peace.

Based on this Declaration, Minato City is engaged in various activities towards the realization of world peace. As a part of these activities, in April 2010 we joined "Mayors for Peace," a global coalition of cities that seeks the abolition of nuclear weapons.

Mayors for Peace currently has 8,188 member cities in 166 countries as of July 1, 2022.

Together with other cities around the world that are working towards the realization of world peace, Minato City will continue to send out message about the importance and preciousness of peace.

August 15, 1985

We are working to build a community dedicated to the welfare of its citizens, while striving for true peace and the preservation of our cultural traditions.

Our duty to the generations that will follow is to hand over into their keeping a society built on the brotherhood of all people and a natural environment that is flourishing and beautiful.
