Exemption System for National Pension Plan Premiums

An exemption system is in place for the National Pension Plan, designed for people having difficulties paying the premiums. There are four types of exemptions available: 25%, 50%, 75% and full.

Other systems are available for students and people aged 49 and under if their own or their spouse's income, or in the case of a student their own income in the previous year from the year of the application is lower than the criteria. The exemption period will not reflect the amount of pension benefits. An applicant may apply for an exemption up to 25 months retroactively.

Income criteria

If the income of each person, her/his spouse or the head of her/his household in the previous year from the year of the application is lower than the designated amount, that person is deemed eligible for the exemption system. The criterion varies by the number of household members. The exemption system includes special cases such as unemployment, disasters and other reasons.

Eligibility period

The period of the exemption is included in the eligibility period to receive the Basic Pension for the Elderly, the Basic Disability Pension, and the Basic Survivors' Pension.

Calculation of the annuity of the Basic Pension for the Elderly

Compared to cases in which the premiums are fully paid, in cases when payment exemptions apply, the amount of the pension benefits will be calculated with the below stated ratio in the chart, compared to those who paid premiums fully.

Types of exemptions	Calculation ratio for the exemptions admitted after April 2009	Calculation ratio for the exemptions admitted before March 2009
Full	1/2	1/3
75%	5/8	1/2
50%	3/4	2/3
25%	7/8	5/6

Note: If a person does not pay her/his premiums for the partially exempted period, this period will be excluded in the calculation of his/her pension benefits.

Deferred premium payments

Premiums unpaid due to the exemption system can be paid in arrears within 10 years after the exemption period.

2023 National Health Insurance Premium Statements and Payment Slips

National Health Insurance (NHI) premium statements and payment slips based on the income during the year 2022 will be sent to heads of households on June 14.

Calculation of insurance premiums

Annual health insurance premium amount is calculated based on the number of the enrolled health insurance members and the total income amount of the household in the year 2022.

Reduction of insurance premiums

For households whose total annual income earned between January and December of the previous year is below designated levels, the per capita amount of their NHI premiums are reduced by 70%, 50%, or 20%. Whether a household qualifies for a reduction will be determined by total household income. Therefore, residents are required to declare the income of all household members, even in cases when there is no income.

Reduction measure for involuntary termination of employment

People who have lost their jobs due to corporate restructuring or other reasons may be eligible for NHI premium reduction.

Eligibility:

- 1) People who have left their jobs due to business reasons on the part of their employers, such as bankruptcy or labor reduction.
- 2) People who have left their jobs due to reasons stipulated under the Employment Insurance Act, for example the expiration of their employment contract. Applicants should bring their Certificate of Eligibility for Employment Insurance to apply to the City Office.

Mailing of payment slips

Please pay the annual insurance premiums with the payment slips that will be sent in mid-June. There are two types of payment slips: one divided in ten installments from June to March of the following year and one for a lump-sum payment for twelve months. Those who are paying premiums by bank transfer or deducted by Special Collection will only receive the premium statements.

Payments

You can pay your insurance premiums by banks, credit unions, credit cooperatives, the Japan Post Office Bank, convenience stores, Mobile Regi or by using your smartphone (LINE Pay, PayPay, au PAY, d Pay, J-Coin Pay). You can also pay through the counter services of Regional City Offices or Minato City Hall. Please note that payments cannot be made at convenience stores or via mobile payment if the amount shown on a single premium payment slip exceeds ¥300,000.

Notification of premium changes

Eligibility Subsection will review health insurance premiums when residents join or withdraw from the NHI or when there are changes in the amount of income. **Supervising Subsection:** Eligibility and Premium Subsection

Fees

Fee for two hours: ¥500 for adults, ¥100 for elementary, junior high and high school students.

Free admission for preschool children, 65 years old and over and people with disabilities residing in Minato City. The first and third Sundays are admission free days for Minato City residents. The second and fourth Saturdays are admission free for elementary, junior high and high school students residing in Minato City.

A registration card is required for high school students and above. If you don't have a registration card, bring your ID that proves your residence or workplace in Minato City. A card will be issued on the reception.

Notes for usage of Minato City swimming pools

- Please wear swimsuits and caps.
- Do not bring flotation rings and other swimming aids
- Children under 3 and toddlers wearing diapers may not enter the pools.
- Children grade 3 of elementary school and under must be accompanied by an adult when swimming. An adult may accompany up to 2 children.
- Junior high school students and under using the pool facilities at night must be accompanied by an adult.

Spring Vaccination Program from 5/8, 2023

The COVID-19 Vaccination program in Spring 2023 started from 5/8.

Eligibility

Residents who received first and second vaccination and received their last vaccination more than three months ago.

Also one of the following must apply.

1. 65 years and older

- 2. 5 to 64 years with an underlying condition, or people assessed by a doctor to be at high risk of developing serious illness
- Medical workers, people working at elderly facilities/facilities for people with disabilities

Vaccination vouchers

Vaccination vouchers has been sent sequentially from April 24.

Vaccination vouchers are issued based on applications for those who are under 64 years old, those which the City is unable to ascertain if they have underlying conditions based on their disability certificates, medical workers, etc.

Vaccination vouchers are not sent to those who have not used their vouchers after the third vaccination. You can use the vaccination voucher that you already have.
