Application for 2024 Municipal Kindergarten Enrollment

Minato City municipal kindergartens will be accepting applications for children aged 3, 4, and 5. For more details, please visit the Minato Web after 11/10.

Eligibility

Applicants must qualify for all the criteria below. 1. Both guardians and children have an address in Minato City and children were born within the following periods:

- 3 years old: 4/2, 2020—4/1, 2021
- 4 years old: 4/2, 2019—4/1, 2020
- 5 years old: 4/2, 2018—4/1, 2019

For 5 years old, recruitment will not be conducted at all, but the applications will be accepted all the time.

2. Guardians are able to accompany children to and from the kindergarten.

WELFARE

National Pension System

All residents turning 20 must enroll in Japan's National Pension plan

Everyone living in Japan, including foreign residents, aged between 20 and 60 must enroll in the National Pension System. After enrolling, if you fulfill the necessary criteria you will receive the Basic Pension for the Elderly. If you were to become disabled due to an injury or illness, you would receive the Basic Disability Pension. If you were to pass away, your spouse and/or children would receive the Basic Survivors' Pension. If you are not a Japanese citizen and leave Japan without receiving a pension, you can claim a lumpsum withdrawal refund within two years after your departure if you have paid at least six months of the premium payment period.

Enrollment is unnecessary if you are:

- Enrolled in an employee pension plan
- A dependent spouse of a person enrolled in an employee pension plan
- A citizen of a country which has concluded a social security agreement with Japan and thus exempt from enrolling in Japan's National Pension plan
- Person with medical stay or long stay visa for sightseeing and recreation

Payment method / payment slips

Once you have submitted your notification of enrollment, the Pension Office sends you payment slips. Please make the payments at banks, convenience stores, or any other applicable locations. Credit card and bank transfer payments are also acceptable. Premium discounts are available if you opt for advance lump-sum payment.

Additional Pension plan

In the Additional Pension Plan under the National Pension Plan, if you pay your monthly flat premium amount plus ¥400 per month, you will be eligible to receive additional benefits with your Basic Pension for the Elderly. The additional pension amount is calculated by multiplying ¥200 and the number of months that the additional premium was paid.

This amount will be added to your annual pension benefits. If you wish to enroll in additional pension insurance, you will need to make the necessary application.

Exemptions

The following systems are available for anyone having difficulties paying the premiums. Please inquire for more information.

- Exemption System full or partial payment exemption
- Contribution Postponement System for Low Income Persons
- Special Deferral System for Students
- Pre and Post Childbirth Exemption System

12/1 is World AIDS Day

11/16 to 12/15 is the Tokyo Metropolitan AIDS Prevention Month.

HIV infection weakens the immune system, which causes AIDS. Early stage detection and early treatment are essential to prevent the spread of infection.

Conduct HIV checkup at least 60 days after the date of possible infection, or 90 days for on that day checkup.

CHILD CARE

The Current Situation of Children in Need of Social Care and the Foster Parent System

There are about 4,000 children in Tokyo who are unable to live with their families due to various circumstances such as child abuse, disease, divorce, and financial reasons.

The foster parent system is a system for children in which they are welcomed into families and brought up with love and understanding. If you are interested in the foster parent system, please feel free to contact the Foster Parent Consultation Dial.

There are various types of foster parents, including "adoptive foster parents" who aim to adopt children, and "foster families" who do not aim to adopt children, but welcome and bring up children in their own homes for a certain period of time.

No special qualifications or experience are required to become a foster parent. Foster parents are paid the necessary fees to nurture the children. Dual income working couples and people who are raising children can become foster parents.



Foster Family Experience and Presentation

Every October and November is Foster Parents Month. The Tokyo Metropolitan Government and Minato City hold Foster Family Experience and Presentation.

It enables to hear the experiences of real foster parents, including joys, wonders, difficulties, and struggles of raising children as foster families.
