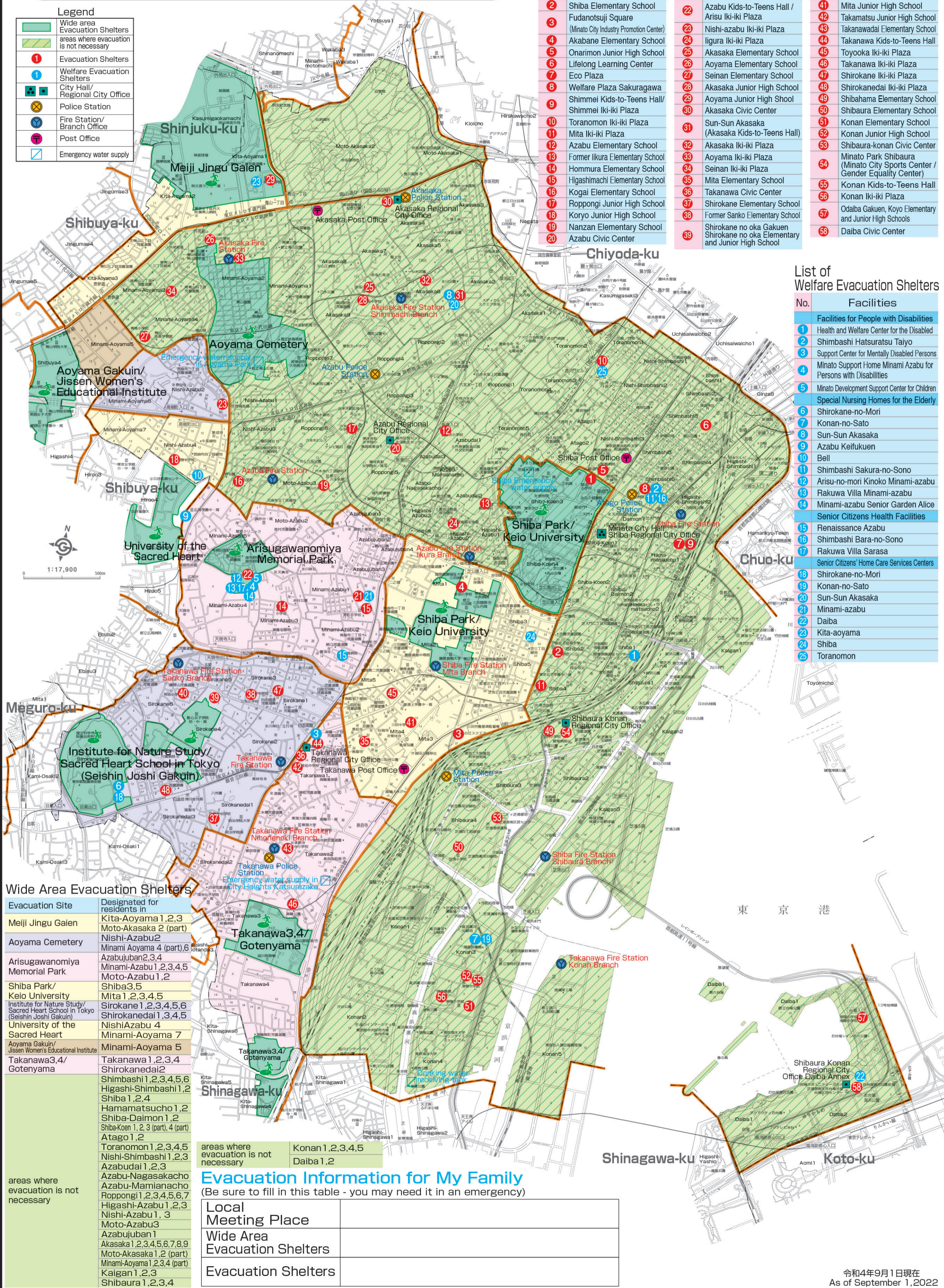

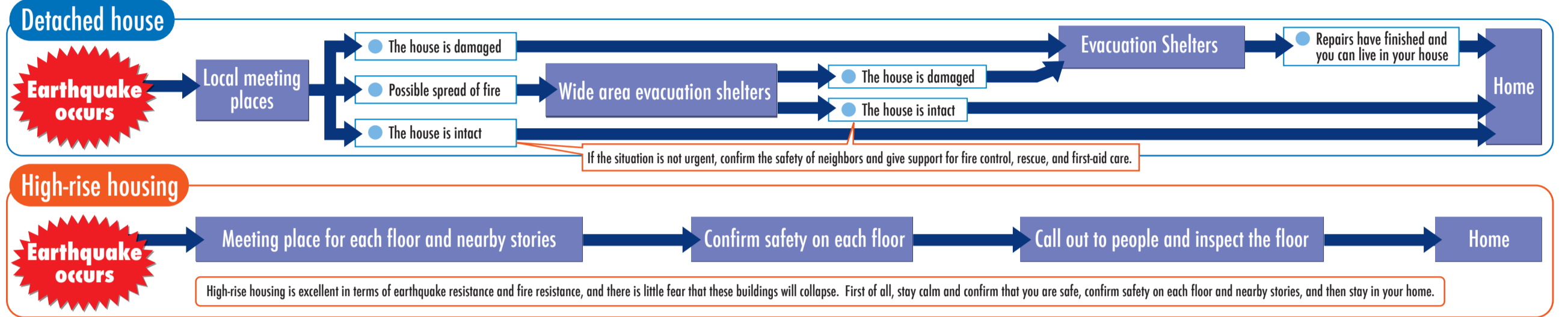

What are "designated emergency evacuation sites"? "Designated emergency evacuation sites" are facilities or sites free from disaster risk that have been designated for each type of extraordinary phenomena, including floods and tsunamis, as safe evacuation sites for residents, etc. (residents, stayers and other individuals who were moved for evacuation purposes included) in cases where the risk of a disaster is imminent in accordance with Article 49.4.1 of the Basic Act on Disaster Management.

What roles do the different evacuation shelters (evacuation areas) have?

We recommend 'evacuating at home' where you will continue to live at home during a disaster unless this is impractical due to a fire or structural damage to your dwelling following a major earthquake. Please use discretion and demonstrate a spirit of cooperation with others at shelters (evacuation site).

Local Meeting Place	This is a place where neighbors temporarily gather to confirm one another's safety and receive first aid before going to an Wide area evacuation shelter. An area is established for each neighborhood association. Residents of high-rise building should gather on their own floor or a nearby floor for safety confirmation.
Wide area evacuation shelter	This is a place for temporary evacuation as a precaution against the danger of spreading fire after an earthquake. Residents will return home once the danger has passed if their homes are undamaged. Residents who can no longer live at home due to damage will go to a residents' evacuation site.
Evacuation Shelters	This is a temporary living space for people whose homes have been damaged in a disaster-related collapse or fire. Residents return to their homes once repairs are completed and they can resume their lives there. Evacuation centers also serve as centers for providing supplies to not only evacuees but also people continuing to live at home and for disseminating information.
Welfare-related evacuation shelter	A temporary place to live for elderly and people with special needs who require nursing or other services and who therefore find it difficult to live in a Evacuation Shelter.
areas where evacuation is not necessary	Area where people do not have to go to a Wide area evacuation shelter because there is little danger from the spread of fire caused by an earthquake.

Record: 1. You will not be able to enter a number unless it is from the disaster area. 2. Enter the telephone number of your home or mobile phone. 3. Record (30 seconds or less). 4. Playback: Enter the same telephone number as on the left. 5. Playback. 6. End: 9.

Disaster Message Board

How to Confirm Using Text (Packet Communications)

Use the Disaster Message Board Service provided by mobile phone carriers

How to Post Messages: Select "Disaster Message Board" displayed at the top of the Menu. Select "Register Msg" from the Disaster Message Board. Register Msg, Confirm Msg, Delete Msg, Service Areas, How to Use.

How to Check Messages: Select "Confirm Msg" from the Disaster Message Board. Register Messages: Current Situation (I'm okay, Need help, Safe at home, At evacuation area), Comment (up to 100 full-size or 200 half-size characters), Mobile phone number, Search.

Leave information on the current situation in the "Current Situation" and "Comment" sections.

Note: Registration of messages is only possible via mobile phone. It is possible to check the messages via mobile phone or computer.

Disaster prevention in the home

When disaster strikes, it is important to protect yourself.

Avoiding injury in your home

- Roughly 30 to 50% of injuries resulting from an earthquake's motion are caused by falling or tipping furniture.
- To reduce the chance of injury in your home during an earthquake, take a fresh look at your living space. For example, see if your furniture is firmly fixed in place and reexamine its installation and arrangement.
- Minato City provides fixtures to prevent furniture tipping free of charge to households in the city.

Be prepared

Keep a stock of at least 7 days' worth of food and drinking water per person. Especially in the event of an earthquake, toilets may become unusable due to damaged drainage pipes or the like. You should also prepare a portable toilet and the like.

Stay prepared with "self-protection" always in mind so that you can continue living safely in your own home even after disaster strikes. The ward's emergency supplies mediation program offers a variety of emergency supplies such as fixtures to prevent furniture from overturning, glass shatterproof film, or portable toilets, below their regular prices.

Disaster prevention wireless system
