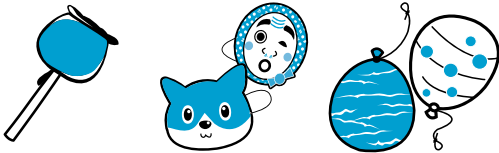

Disaster Preparedness Supplies Available at Subsidized Prices

Minato City offers selected disaster preparedness supplies at special subsidized prices for residents who may have difficulty obtaining such items on their own.

Eligibility

Residents of Minato City who are registered as residents and meet any of the following criteria:

1. Households consisting solely of people aged 65 or older
2. Households consisting solely of people who hold a Physical Disability Certificate (Grades 1-3)
3. Households consisting solely of people who hold an Ai-no-Techo (Intellectual Disability Certificate) (Levels 1-2)
4. Households consisting solely of people who hold a Mental Disability Health and Welfare Certificate (Grade 1)
5. Pregnant women who have received a Maternal and Child Health Handbook, or postpartum women up to the end of the month preceding the first anniversary of childbirth
6. Households composed solely of individuals described in items (1) through (5)

Available Items and Prices

Residents of households exempt from resident tax are required to pay 10% of the listed price. Households receiving public assistance are exempt from all charges.

Multilingual Interpreter Call Service

A person who needs translating service, the operator who will interpret and Minato City staff can talk in group of three. Our system allows people to choose their preferred language in advance on their smartphone, and have an entire conversation on the phone with the staff in the various departments of City Hall, through an interpreter. This service is available in 13 languages.
