WELFARE **National Pension System**

All residents turning 20 must enroll in Japan's National Pension plan

Everyone living in Japan, including foreign residents, aged between 20 and 60 must enroll in the National Pension System. After enrolling, if you fulfill the necessary criteria you will receive the Basic Pension for the Elderly. If you were to become disabled due to an injury or illness, you would receive the Basic Disability Pension. If you were to pass away, your spouse and/or children would receive the Basic Survivors' Pension. If you are not a Japanese citizen and leave Japan without receiving a pension, you can claim a lumpsum withdrawal refund within two years after your departure if you have paid at least six months of the premium payment period. Enrollment is unnecessary if you are:

- Enrolled in an employee pension plan

MEDICAL INSURANCE **Integration of** My Number card and NHI card

With the integration of My Number card and NHI card, NHI card will no longer be issued from 12/2. Thereafter, you can use My Number NHI card.

Registration is required to use My Number NHI card

You can register at medical institutions or pharmacy receptions, or through Mynaportal or a Seven Bank ATM. Prepare My



- A dependent spouse of a person enrolled in an employee pension plan
- A citizen of a country which has concluded a social security agreement with Japan and thus exempt from enrolling in Japan's National Pension plan
- Person with medical stay or long stay visa for sightseeing and recreation

Payment method / payment slips

Once you have submitted your notification of enrollment, the Pension Office sends you payment slips. Please make the payments at banks, convenience stores, or any other applicable locations. Credit card and bank transfer payments are also acceptable. Premium discounts are available if you opt for advance lump-sum payment.

Exemptions

Exemptions systems are available for anyone having difficulties paying the premiums. Please inquire for more information.



The rights of children are established in the Convention on the Rights of the Child. It recognizes that every child has various rights as a human being just like an adult.

The four fundamental principles of the Convention on the Rights of the Child are as follows:

Preventing Norovirus

Norovirus is caused by ingesting even a small amount of contaminated foods, etc., and the virus growing in your intestine. Many people experience vomiting, stomach pains, diarrhea, fevers, etc., for 24 to 48 hours after initial infection.

In order to prevent food poisoning caused by Norovirus:

- 1. Wash your hands after using a toilet, before and after cooking, and before eating, etc.
- 2. Heat clams, etc. that may have been contaminated, and if food is to be heated, the core part of the food should be heated at 85 to 90 degrees for at least 90 seconds.
- 3. Disinfect cooking utensils, etc., with boiling water or chlorine bleach.

11/16 to 12/15 is the Tokyo Metropolitan AIDS Prevention Month.

HIV infection weakens the immune system, which causes AIDS. This year's World AIDS Day campaign theme is "U=U: Revisiting our understanding. December 1st is World AIDS Day." AIDS is a disease that develops when the immune system is weakened due to HIV infection. With advancements in treatment medications, if appropriate treatment is started early, it is now possible to suppress the onset of AIDS and lead a normal life. For early detection and treatment, it is important to get tested.

Minato City municipal kindergartens will be accepting applications for children aged 3, 4, and 5. For more details, please visit the Minato Web after 11/11.

Eligibility

- Applicants must qualify for all the criteria below.
- 1. Both guardians and children have an address in Minato City and children were born within the following periods:
- 3 years old: 4/2, 2021-4/1, 2022
- 4 years old: 4/2, 2020-4/1, 2021
- *5 years old: 4/2, 2019—4/1, 2020
- *For 5 years old, recruitment will not be conducted, but the application will be accepted if there is vacancy for 4 years old.
- 2. Guardians are able to accompany children to and from the kindergarten.

Applications are accepted at kindergartens from 2:30 to 4:30 p.m., and at the School Affairs Section from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. **Note:** Applicants will be selected by a drawing in case the number of applicants exceeds the capacity.
