We conducted field tests using a wheelchair when we created this map. In addition to sightseeing and barrier-free information for each facility, we provide actual photographs of barrier-free information on travel routes and points of travel, and display them in an easy-to-understand manner.

Please note that the time required for each course and travel time will vary depending on the physical condition, health, and the standard of the wheelchair (such as whether it is manual or electric) of the person going on the tour, so please use this information as a guide only.

Additionally, each course may require a caregiver as there are some places where it is difficult for the wheelchair user to move or brake on their own (this map was created based on the assumption that a caregiver will accompany the wheelchair user).

The map suggests just one example of a route for the course, so please feel free to change the course according to your mood or the season.


