

Konan Course

A course offering enjoyment along the canal waters as well as nature

Time required **3.1** hours Travel time **71** minutes Total travel distance **4.3** km



POINT!
Use an elevator at Shinagawa Station Konan exit to get to the ground floor.

about 1630m | ⌚ about 27 minutes
 - J-4** Konan Ryokusui Park
about 450m | ⌚ about 8 minutes

Course Feature
This route is flat, short and relatively wide, so you can take a stroll easily.

TOPIC

Canal landscape
There are many canals in the Shibaura-Konan district. You can get a sense of the wide waterside spaces.

VIEW SPOT
You can enjoy flowers in each season.

VIEW SPOT
You can look at the canal up close.

VIEW SPOT
Let's take a break, looking at Takahama Canal.

VIEW SPOT
There is a steep uphill road before the bridge (4°-5° gradient).

VIEW SPOT
There is a barrier-free restroom at the top of the slope.

VIEW SPOT
Use a slope to get from the canal to the road.

VIEW SPOT
6° slope that narrows under the bridge.

VIEW SPOT
Pass under the bridge.

J-1 Shinagawa Season Terrace

Duration **40** minutes

Space where city and nature coexist

High-rise building with offices, restaurants, merchandising, and clinics has a vast green area, and the seasonal scenery offers visitors comfort and peace. It is also directly connected to Shibaura Central Park, creating an integrated bustle.



J-2 Shibaura Central Park

Duration **20** minutes

Observing living creatures at the botanical garden of wetlands

The park has a botanical garden of wetlands, fountain, lawn open space with wooden playground equipment, and dog-run. In the rose garden, many rose trees have been planted. The best time to see is around May and October.

J-3 Museum of Marine Science, Tokyo University of Marine Science and Technology

Duration **40** minutes

A natural history museum displaying marine specimens

Under the theme of "Invitation to the Sea," approximately 2,000 items related to the ocean and Tokyo University of Marine Science and Technology are on display, including marine animal taxidermy and skeletal specimens, models of training ships, fishing gear, and processed seafood products. The Whale Gallery in the annex has full skeleton specimens of a North Pacific right whale and a gray whale.

J-4 Konan Ryokusui Park

Duration **20** minutes

Waterside space where you can experience nature

Inside the park, there are trees that colour differently in each season, fountains nature observation ponds (biotope), and scenic plaza where you can interact with nature and water. There are also disaster-response facilities. From inside the park, you can also see the Tokyo Monorail and Shinkansen.
