0-1 Atago-jinja Shrine

Duration
20 minutes

Famous for stone steps of career advancement

Located at the summit of Mt. Atago (26m high), the highest in Tokyo's 23 districts and a natural topographical feature, it enshrined the god for protection against fire in the Edo period. Said to be an excellent spot with the best view of the Edo, the painter Hiroshige Utagawa used it as a theme of his printmaking.

0-2 NHK Museum of Broadcasting

'Home of Broadcasting'

Radio broadcasting began in Japan in 1925, and a broadcasting station was built on Atagoyama. At the NHK Museum of Broadcasting in Atagoyama, visitors can experience the wonders of broadcasting through exhibits featuring radios, televisions, cameras, and broadcast footage, as well as interactive spaces like the Experience Broadcast Studio and 8K Theater.

Advanced facility to learn about science

In addition to the permanent exhibition area, visitors of all ages can enjoy learning science through four annual special exhibitions, science shows held in the laboratory, and various other events. On the 2nd floor planetarium hall, visitors can enjoy the beautiful starry sky as well as diverse programs.

0-4 Musée Tomo

A museum of ceramic art

Musée Tomo opened in 2003 on a secluded hill in Toranomon, Minato City, to introduce contemporary ceramic art based on the collection of Tomo Kikuchi, the museum's founder and a collector of contemporary ceramic art. Rotating exhibitions are held about three times a year.

0-5 Okura Museum of Art

Private art museum with eye-catching Chinese architecture

A private art museum and the predecessor of the Okura Museum of Art, which was established by Kihachiro Okura, a businessman in the Meiji and Taisho periods. The museum contains about 2,500 items, including three National Treasures, 13 Important Cultural Properties, and 44 Important Works of Art, collected by Kihachiro and his son, Kishichiro, from various regions of Japan and Asia.

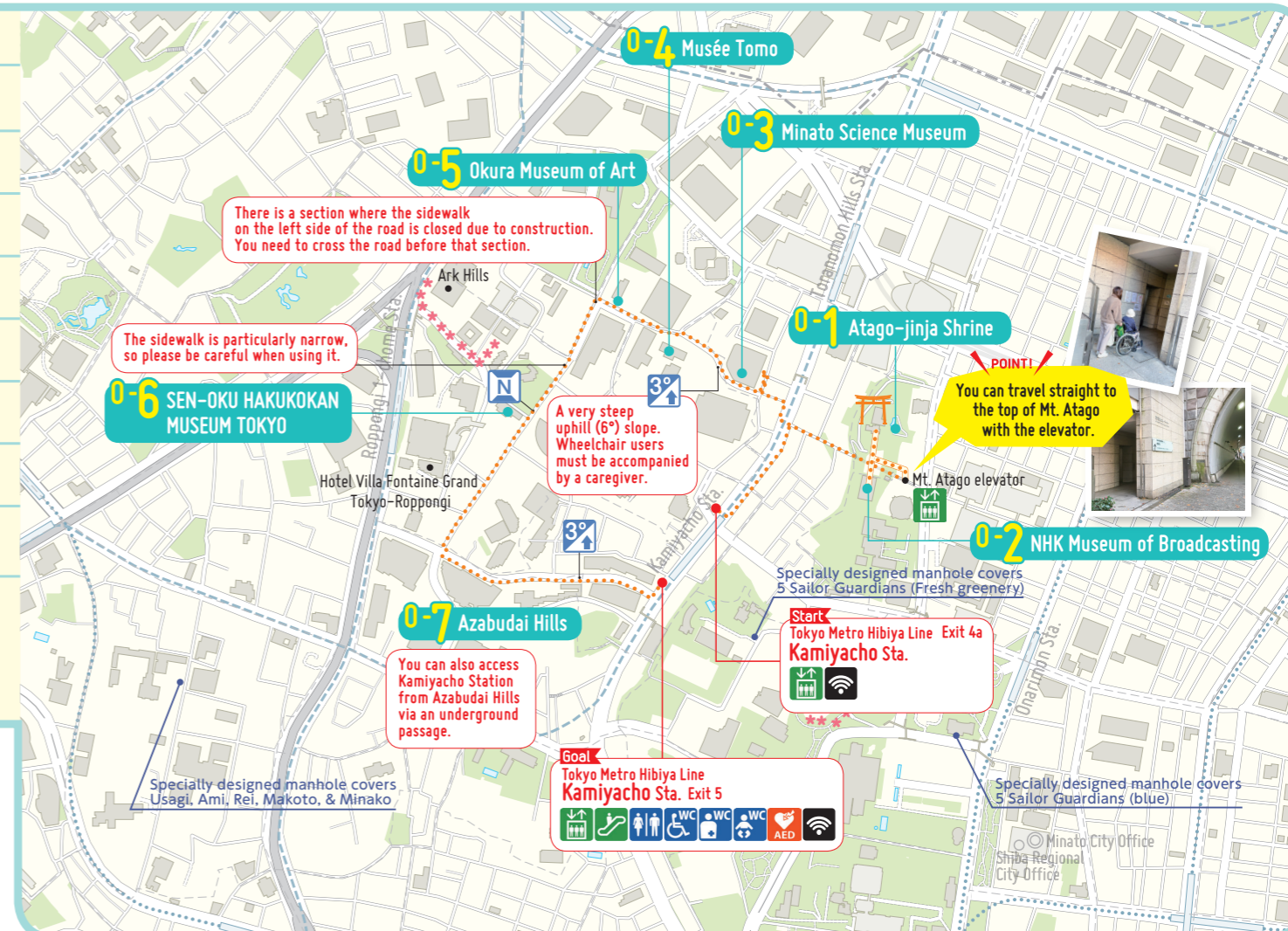

Take your time with the Sumitomo family collection

The museum opened in 2002 on the site of the former Azabu villa of the Sumitomo family as a branch of the SEN-OKU HAKUKOKAN MUSEUM (located in Shishigatani, Kyoto), which preserves and exhibits artworks, mainly from the Sumitomo Collection. The museum was renamed SEN-OKU HAKUKOKAN MUSEUM TOKYO in April 2021 and reopened in 2022 after being renovated. Four to five rotating and special exhibitions are held annually.

Azabudai Hills is a new large-scale complex with offices, residences, commercial facilities, a market, hotel, museum, gallery, international school, and medical facility. Tower Plaza, located in the 330-meter-high Mori JP Tower, and the low-rise Garden Plaza have about 150 commercial tenants.
