There are many slopes in the first half of the course. In particular the road to Happo-en continues steeply, so we recommend that you be accompanied by a caregiver.





This temple enshrines Kiyomasa Kato, a general from the Warring States period. Many people visit to pray for victory over the challenges in their life. The temple also enshrines Buddhist deity Bishamonten, one of the Yamate seven lucky gods. During the Kiyomasa Festival, held every year on May 4 and 5, visitors can receive special victory

Opened November 2018. In addition to permanent exhibits utilizing digital technology that cover the nature, history and culture of Minato City, the museum occasionally hosts special and temporary exhibits on a variety of themes. The former Institute of Public Health was built in 1938 and is rich in character and design. The museum is free of charge, except for permanent, special, and temporary exhibitions.


