

Birth Notification Counter Services Subsection, Residents Support Section, Regional City Office (see back cover) (Family Registry Subsection only in the Shiba Regional City Office)

You will receive your child's birth certificate (along with the birth notification) from the hospital in which you give birth.

The parent (father or mother) should submit a birth notification to the city hall or municipal office with jurisdiction over the location where the baby was born, the location where their family is registered, or their home address, within 14 days (within three months if born outside of

Japan).

The parent should be sure to bring the Maternal and Child Health Handbook and their personal seal with them when submitting the notification.

If you are covered by National Health Insurance, be sure to also bring your National Health Insurance card.



Birth Announcement

Once your baby is born, send the Birth Announcement postcard enclosed in your Maternal and Child Health Handbook to the Minato Public Health Center by postal mail. This is in addition to submitting your birth notification. Contact us if you do not have the Minato City Birth Announcement @ postcard due to moving, etc.

The Minato Public Health Center conducts "Hello, Baby! Visits" and sends information about mother and child health services, etc., based on the submission of the birth announcement.

Newborn Hearing Inspection

O Go to a newborn hearing inspection

The newborn hearing inspection is a test used to see whether a newborn has a hearing impairment, conducted while the baby is asleep.

About 1-2 babies out of 1,000 are born with some sort of hearing impairment.

It is critical that such a hearing impairment be discovered sooner rather than later, as receiving the appropriate support at an early stage will result in greater benefits with regard to communication, language development, etc.

O Subsidy for newborn hearing inspection

You will receive one newborn hearing inspection form alongside your prenatal check-up forms, etc., when you receive your Maternal and Child Health Handbook. The costs for the items listed as "(Not covered by insurance)" on these check-up forms may be subsidized by public funds.

The check-up forms listed above may only be used at designated medical facilities in the Tokyo metropolitan area. You may apply for a partial subsidy for the costs incurred by your newborn hearing inspection if you undergo your checkups at a medical institution outside of the Tokyo metropolitan area.

Hello, Baby! Visits

(Visits to All Households with Newborns)

Public Healthcare Subsection, Health Promotion Section, Minato Public Health Center 6400-0084

The Minato Public Health Center conducts "Hello, Baby! visits" based on the submission of birth announcements. The period immediately following childbirth, when the mother is often still recovering physically and is not used to living with the new baby, is often marked by worries and anxiety.

Visits are made to your home to take your baby's weight and measurements, and to offer childcare consultations, information on postpartum health, and referrals to available mother and child health services.

Eligibility: All households with children 120 days old or younger

Method: Home visit by midwife/public health nurse

Postpartum Maternal and Child Care Services

Public Healthcare Subsection, Health Promotion Section, Minato Public Health Center 6400-0084

Specialized staff provide childcare support to mothers during pregnancy and after childbirth, in order to soothe the mothers physically and emotionally and encourage the healthy development of the baby.

Mother and Child Health Care Counseling Counter Administered by Midwives

We field inquiries concerning worries and concerns from expectant and nursing mothers about pregnancy, childbirth, and childrearing through phone calls and interviews. We provide individual advice based on the individual conditions of each mother and baby.

Health Consultation for Mothers

Postpartum Maternal and Childcare Short-Stay Service

O Day Care (Salon) Services

*You may use this service after your child has completed their one-month newborn check-up.

Hello Mama Salon (no reservation required)

Consists of lectures by midwives and social events aimed at babies aged 1-2 months and their guardians.

Nombiri Salon (no reservation required)

An open space where mothers can socialize with one another, aimed at babies aged 1-3 months and their guardians.

Usa-chan Club (no reservation required)

A club for babies aged 2-3 months and their guardians. Meetings consist of self-introductions and mini-lectures given by midwives. Participants are divided up into groups by region, so these meetings are a great opportunity to make friends with other mothers in your neighborhood! It is also an opportunity to exchange information and find out how others are engaging in childcare. The Usa-chan Club also offers Bookstart.

*The dates on which you can participate depend on your child's birth month, etc. Be sure to check the Koho Minato and the Minato City official website for details.

Those who are unable to receive support for childcare and housework from their families, etc., can get mother-child care and advice on breastfeeding and childcare while staying at a medical institution subcontracted by the City. Infant Vaccinations

A baby's resistance to infection from their mother starts to weaken after they turn three months old. Make sure to boost their immune system with vaccinations to prevent infectious diseases.

The Minato Public Health Center sends vaccination screening forms to all children who are about to reach the eligible age for vaccinations. Don't forget to get them vaccinated.

The Minato Maternal and Child Health Handbook app will automatically create a vaccination schedule based on your child's birth date. Be sure to make use of it.

Children's Medical Expense Assistance

Children's Benefit Subsection, Child and Family Section3578-2430

The City provides assistance with the out-of-pocket portion of medical expenses incurred when a **child who has not yet completed junior high school** (up to March 31 after the child turns 15 years old) receives treatment or medication covered by health insurance. Parents/guardians and children must be residing in Minato City and have Japanese public health insurance. A medical certificate will be provided based on the results of the application process. There is no income limit for guardians.

*Children in households receiving public welfare assistance, who have been admitted into a facility, etc., are not eligible for this assistance.

*To apply, submit the application form within 15 days of the day after your child's birth date your move-in date, either by mail to the Children's Benefit Subsection; in person at the Health and Welfare Subsection, Residents Support Section, Regional City Office; or online through Mynaportal.

O What You Need to Apply

You will need your child's health insurance card.

O How to Apply

(1) If using a medical institution in the Tokyo metropolitan area

Show your child's health insurance card and infant medical certificate at the counter of the medical institution, and you will be able to receive treatment and/or medication without having to pay the out-of-pocket portion of your medical expenses.

(2) If using a medical institution outside of the Tokyo metropolitan area, or a medical institution that does not accept infant medical certificates

After paying the out-of-pocket portion of your medical expenses, submit the designated application form, along with the original receipt, either by mail to the Children's Benefit Subsection or in person at the Health and Welfare Subsection, Residents Support Section, Regional City Office. The funds will be deposited into the guardian's bank account, listed on the infant medical certificate.

Assistance for Medical Expenses for Childhood Illnesses

Special Medical Care

If a newborn that is born at a weight of up to 2,000 grams or that is particularly weak and developing certain symptoms is hospitalized in a designated hospital, part of the costs may be waived.

Institutional Medical Care Benefit

This benefit is paid if a child under the age of 18 contracts tuberculosis and has to be hospitalized in a designated hospital for treatment.

Childrearing Medical Care

Assistance with medical expenses will be provided for children under the age of 18 who have an orthopedic impairment or a sight, hearing, equilibrium, vocal, speech, or masticatory disorder, as well as children who have to undergo surgery at a designated hospital due to coronary disease, kidney disease, congenital visceral disease, and/or a liver disorder.

Infantile Chronic Diseases

Assistance with medical expenses will be provided for children under the age of 18 who have a malignant neoplasm, chronic respiratory disease, chronic kidney disease, heart disease, endocrine disease, collagen disease, diabetes, inborn error of metabolism, blood disorder, immune disorder, neuromuscular disease, chronic digestive disease/disorder, congenital anomaly syndrome, and/or skin disease.

Childcare Allowance

A childcare allowance is provided in order to support the healthy development of the children who will lead our society into the future. The allowance is issued to residents of Minato City raising children who are in junior high school or younger.

*To apply, submit the application form within 15 days of the day after your child's birth date/your move-in date, either by mail to the Children's Benefit Subsection; in person at the Health and Welfare Subsection, Residents Support Section, Regional City Office; or online through Mynaportal.

*If you are a civil servant, please apply through your workplace rather than your own address.

We support breastfeeding!

Breastmilk is full of nutrients that support baby's growth. It also includes immune-boosting substances that protect the baby from disease, and is readily digested and absorbed into their system. The act of breastfeeding is also an important form of skin-to-skin contact that will help build a relationship of trust between the mother and the baby. As such, many mothers want to raise their baby on breastmilk as much as possible. However, breastfeeding can come with its own issues - for instance, not being able to produce as much milk as you'd like, or your breasts feeling swollen and extremely painful. If you experience any of these issues, it would be a good idea to consult the hospital where you gave birth. The following is a list, for your reference, that has examples of facilities that offer breastfeeding consultation services in the Minato City area.
