Waste & Recycling Collection

Please note that Minato City will not collect waste and recyclables between December 31 and January 3. Basically, waste and recyclables are collected until December 30. However, some regions collecting combustible waste on Tuesday and Friday will collect combustible waste in January 5. From the new year, waste and recyclables will be collected from January 4.

When discarding waste, please leave it in the designated areas by 8 a.m. or by 7:30 a.m. at special regions. Don't discard any garbage for the period between December 31 and January 3. For more information, please visit Minato City Web.

The Minato Recycling and Waste Management Office will be closed from 4:25 p.m. on December 30 until 7:40 a.m. on January 4. Please note that after the holidays, collection may be delayed due to an increase of waste and traffic conditions.

Large-Sized Waste Center schedule

The Large-Sized Waste Center will be closed during the holidays. Reservations made via telephone will be suspended from 7 p.m. on December 28 until 8 a.m. on January 4. Online reservations will not be accepted from midnight on December 29 until 11:59 p.m. on January 3.

Discarding large-sized waste

1. Call or make a reservation online at the Large-Sized Waste Center at 03-5296-7000 or http://sodai. tokyokankyo.or.jp, specifying the waste you would like to be collected. If you apply online, you will need to confirm your reservation within 24 hours of issuing a temporary reservation.

- 2. Purchase a large-sized waste ticket of the amount specified during your reservation.
- 3. Write your name or the 4-digit number provided during your reservation and the date of collection on the ticket and place it in a visible place on the item you will be discarding. Place the waste at the designated area by 8 a.m. on the day of the collection. Please note that large-sized garbage collection is conducted in reservation order, so

contact the center in advance if you wish to discard something within this year.

Electrical Household Appliance Recycling Center schedule

To discard air conditioners, TVs, refrigerators, freezers and washing/drying machines, contact the stores where you purchased them directly or the Home Appliance Recycling Center at 03-5296-7200 (Japanese auto-operator only).

The Home Appliance Recycling Center will be closed from 5 p.m. on December 28 until 8 a.m. on January 4. Online services will be unavailable from midnight on December 29 until 11:59 p.m. on January 3. The largest amount of waste throughout the year is produced during the New Year's holiday season. We kindly ask for your cooperation in waste discarding in order to start a new year in a clean environment.

Certificate Issuance during the Holidays

If you need any certificates during the New Year's holidays, please use these methods.

Convenience stores

Available time: 6:30 a.m. to 11 p.m.; until December 28 and start from January 4 Closed; December 29 to January 3

Stores: 7-Eleven, Lawson, Family Mart, Community Store and Ministop with a multiple copying machine

To receive the certificate you will need your My Number card or Basic Resident Registration card and PIN number. For more details, please inquire at the Counter Services Subsections of Regional City Offices.

Certificates that can be issued: Certificate of Residence, Certificate of Seal Registration, Certificate of Family Register, Last three years of Taxation and Tax Payment Certificate, Supplementary Certificate of Family Register *Some services are not available.

Telephone reservation service

Certificates that can be issued: Certificate of Residence and Certificate of Seal Registration

Appointments and receipt of the certificate must be made in person and cannot be made by proxies.

How to make an appointment and receive certificates

Please make an appointment by phone in person by 4 p.m. on weekdays at Regional City Offices. Please note that the place where you call differs according to the pick-up venue for certificates.

To pick up the documents, your personal ID such as driver's license or passport and the issuance fee ¥300 are required. Please have exact change. To receive the seal registration, you also need your seal registration card.

Issuance of Individual Number Card

Individual Number Card or My Number Card is a card containing an IC chip, your name, address, date of birth, gender, Individual Number and a photograph. This card can be used for ID, as well as for electronic applications, such as e-Tax, and for obtaining certificates, such as the residence certificate at convenience stores.

CHILD SUPPORT

Year-end Child Allowance Applications

A Child Allowance Application must be submitted within 15 days of a child's birth or a day after the date of moving into Minato City. If the City Hall is closed on the 15th day because of the New Year's holidays, submit your application until January 6. For this fiscal year, infants who were born or children who moved to Minato City between December 13 to 21 are eligible. Please note that you may not receive the delayed parts of the allowance if your application is late.

If the application is sent by post, the date of arrival will be listed as the official application date.

Introducing Traditional Culture

Shikki, Lacquerware

Bowls, chopsticks, and other crafts painted with lacquer are called shikki. The lacquer is made by mixing the pigment and sap of the lacquer tree.

One of the techniques used to create *shikki* lacquerware is *makie*. It is a decorative technique in which gold and silver powder is sprinkled before the lacquer completely adheres to the surface. When the lacquer dries, it is painted again with lacquer and polished.

The other decorative technique for lacquerware is raden. Ra means shell and den is to decorate. In this technique, the shiny pearl-like part of a shell is cut into thin pieces, applied on the surface of lacquerware to create a design. As shown on the image below, the contrast of shiny jewel-like design of raden and the calm deep color made by lacquer is truly mesmerizing.

There are craft shops in Minato City which sell various kinds of lacquerwares. In some stores, you can see craftsmen demonstrating their authentic techniques. If you have a chance, please stop by. You may be inspired by the craftsmen's endless effort and creativity.
