




Social Distance

REDUCE WASTE

Reduce, Reuse, Recycle

Please sort waste by type and place it at allocated waste collection stations by 8 a.m. or 7:30 a.m. on the designated day. For more information on waste sorting, disposal and designated collection days, please refer to the English guidebook called "Sorting Recyclables and Waste", English Waste App, or visit the Minato City Web.

Recyclable plastics

Collected once/week

Film, plastic bags, cups, packs, trays, plastic bottles, caps, shock absorbers, such as styrofoam, and daily plastic commodities, such as hangers, straws, and CD cases Rinse before disposal. Plastics that cannot be washed should be disposed of with other combustible waste. All recyclable plastics should be put in the same bag.

Recyclable items

Collected once/week

Newspapers, cardboard, magazines, cartons, other recyclable papers, plastic bottles, and food/beverage cans

Dispose by sorting and bundling used paper by type, rain or shine.

Other recyclable papers can be put in a paper bag or put between magazines. Place advertising leaflets in between newspapers.

Rinse bottles and cans. Place them in the proper containers: yellow for bottles and jars, blue for cans. Remove caps and labels from plastic bottles.

Combustible waste

Collected twice/week

Kitchen waste, unrecyclable paper, pictures, paper cups, rubber products, leather products, CDs, videotapes, clothing, disposable diapers, cooking oil and unwashed plastic containers

When you dispose of waste, please use transparent bags or lidded containers. Remove as much water as possible from kitchen waste before disposal. Before throwing away disposable diapers, flush the waste down the toilet. Cooking oil should be poured on paper or cloth, or coagulated.

Collection boxes to collect used clothes and disposable edible oil are available in municipal facilities. Minato City promotes the reduction of waste and reusing resources.

Incombustible waste

Collected twice/month

Ceramics, glass, metals, spray cans, gas cylinders, lighters, home electronics smaller than 30 cm and light bulbs

Put them into a transparent bag or lidded container.

Empty all spray cans and lighters prior to disposal and separate from other

incombustible waste and label the bag " ± 5 " (danger). Please obey the rule to avoid a vehicle fire.

For safety reasons, please do not poke holes in gas cylinders or spray cans. Breakables, sharp blades, and fluorescent light bulbs should be wrapped in newspapers and also be labeled " $\pm \tau \sim$ ".

Small electric appliances such as cell phones and fluorescent bulbs are collected at municipal facilities. For more details, please contact Minato Call at 03-5472-3710.

Large-sized waste

Large-sized waste refers to items with at least one side longer than 30 cm. Collection of large-sized waste requires an application and a service fee for collection. Apply directly to the Large-Sized Waste Center in advance, affix Large-Sized Waste Tickets for Minato City to each items you are discarding.

Note

For large-sized waste discarded from businesses, contact a private waste collection operator.

The City cannot collect TV sets, air conditioners, refrigerators, freezers, washing machines and clothes dryers. Contact the store where you purchased or plan to purchase such items and confirm the collection method. If you do not know the store where the item was purchased, contact the Electrical Appliances Recycling Reception Center at 03-5296-7200. First a recorded message will play in Japanese. Please wait on the line and do not hang up. And then, you will be connected to an English speaking operator.

PCs are collected and recycled by their respective manufacturers. If you wish to dispose of a PC, contact the manufacturer. When the manufacturer is not known, contact the PC3R Promotion Association, 03-5282-7685 (Japanese only).

HEALTH & SAFETY

Be Careful of Food Poisoning

Bacteria that causes food poisoning increase more easily from the rainy season to summer when the temperature and humidity rise.

Please follow the following rules to prevent food poisoning at home.

1. Wash your hands

There is a lot of invisible dirt and bacteria on your hands.

Wash your hands frequently before and during cooking. Be careful after touching raw meat and fish. Also, after using knife, chopping board, or other kitchen tools, wash them thoroughly, disinfect them using boiling water and chlorine-based bleach, and then dry them before storing them.

2. Prevent the increase of bacteria

Immediately put the food you buy in the refrigerator. Refrigerator temperature needs to be below 10°C. The temperature inside the refrigerator will rise if it is overfilled with food.

Do not leave food out at room temperature, especially frozen food or chilled food.

3. Heating food

Heating food is an effective way to kill bacteria. Bacteria that cause food poisoning are usually unable to withstand heat. Cooking is the most effective way to prevent food poisoning.

Prevent summertime food poisoning with the three food poisoning prevention rules of "wash your hands," "prevent the increase of bacteria," and "heating food."

Part II My number and My Number Card

My Number is a 12 digit number. It does not change even if you move, change jobs, or marry. Foreign residents who are listed in the Resident Registration also have My Number. It is used for social security, taxation, and disaster prevention. Before, it took a lot of time and energy to share information among various government agencies. My Number made the administrative procedures faster and more accurate by specifying his/her information for welfare service, social

My Number Card is a card containing an IC chip and Individual Number. It is issued for those who have residence certificate in Japan and have applied for the

Photograph on the front side and My Number printed on the back side of the card verify your identity. It will expire at his/her 10th birthday for 20 years old and over, and 5th birthday for 19 years old and under.

*Please apply for renewal before it expires. The renewal procedure can be applied from 3 months before the expiration date.

Mayor Masaaki Takei's Career

Born in Tokyo / Age: 67 / Graduated from the School of Political Science and Economics, Waseda University 1977: Started to work in Minato City 2004: Elected as Mayor of Minato City

2020: Elected as Mayor of Minato City for fifth term As a result of the June 7 general election, I will continue to serve as the Mayor of Minato City and lead the city administration with the support of many residents. Because of the impact of the COVID-19, various measures were taken to hold the election. The voter turnout was 30.04%, a 5.79 point increase from the previous election. I would like to express sincere gratitude for everyone's cooperation.

Facing the major crisis posed by the spread of COVID-19, Minato City has exerted every effort to strengthen the medical system and protect the lives and health of residents. The city stabilized the collaboration with the Minato-ku Medical

Association by conducting PCR screening at the Minato Public Health Center, and provided hotel accommodation for children whose parents have been hospitalized.

Regarding the economy, which has been damaged immensely, the city supported local businesses by creating a special financial mediation system for small and medium sized enterprises, and provided rent support for tenants and owners facing difficult business conditions.

Also, while paying careful attention to the problems faced by residents, Minato City has promoted measures to protect residents' daily lives, such as creating area for children and facilitating remote learning, providing shopping assistance for senior citizens, and providing subsidies and financial assistance.

In preparation for the much-feared potential second and third waves, Minato City will continue to reinforce the crisis management structure, including the measures currently being implemented by the Minato Public Health Center.

With the spread of remote working, the city administration must be able to respond quickly and flexibly. The city will lead the society with the cooperation from our residents, businesses, and local governments.

Lastly, Minato City will build a community where all residents can live in safety and comfort. I hope for the active participation and cooperation from our residents for the city administration.

Introducing Traditional Arts and Crafts

Koto

The *koto* or the Japanese harp originally came from China as an instrument for *gagaku*, ancient court music. When music was created for the *koto* as a main instrument in 18th century *Edo*, this instrument was transformed. The

craftsman thickened the *koto*, resulting in a larger volume when it was played. Also, the sound has become clear by making the plectrum larger.

Summer in Japan tends to be very hot. Some people may feel fatigued because of the high temperature. In the hot summer night, when it is hard to sleep, please listen to the sound of the *koto*. You may feel eased by its gentle sound.
