Fourth COVID-19 Vaccination

Eligibility

Residents who have passed five months since their third vaccination, and who fall under either of the following:

1. 60 years old and older
2. 18 to 59 years old with an underlying illness, or people who are deemed by their doctor to be at high risk of serious illness

Vaccination Ticket

Vaccination tickets is sent to 60 years old and older or 18 to 59 years old who have any of the following:

1. *Shintai Shogaisha Techo*, Certificate of the Physically Disabled
2. *Ai-no-Techo*, Certificate of the Intellectually Disabled
3. *Seishin Shogaisha Hoken fukushi Techo*, Certificate of the Mentally Disabled
4. Is receiving the Medical Expense Subsidy to Support the Independence

Note: People who moved to Minato City after their third vaccinations or people with an underlying illness and do not have the aforementioned certificates need to submit application form for vaccination tickets.

Let's Make My Number Card

Part II My Number Card Offer Strong Security

My Number Card is a safe card that you can carry with you and use.

1. My Number Card includes an ID photo, making it difficult to misuse. For procedures using My Number, a photo ID is used to verify the identity of the person, so it is not possible for someone else to misuse. In addition, there are strict penalties for misuse of the My Number.
2. It is difficult to forge a My Number Card.
The letter on the My Number Card is engraved with a laser, and the front of the card is decorated with complex patterns to make it difficult to forge.
3. It is difficult to steal the information recorded in the IC chip.
The IC chip records only the minimum information written on the front of the card, such as the name, address, and date of birth. It does not record information on taxes, pensions, etc. A PIN is required to use the card. This PIN is set for each electronic certificate and application. If you enter the wrong PIN more than a certain number of times, it will be locked. If there is an unauthorized attempt to read the information, it is difficult to steal because of the function that automatically erases the recorded information.
4. The system is available 24 hours, 365 days, even in case of loss or theft. Even if card is lost, you can temporarily suspend the use of My Number Card all the time.
