Application for 2023 Municipal Kindergarten Enrollment

Minato City municipal kindergartens will be accepting applications for children aged 3, 4, and 5. For more details, please visit the Minato Web after November 11.

Eligibility

Applicants must qualify for all the criteria below.

1. Both guardians and children have an address in Minato City and children were born within the following periods:

- 3 years old: April 2, 2019—April 1, 2020
- 4 years old: April 2, 2018—April 1, 2019
- 5 years old: April 2, 2017—April 1, 2018

For 5 years old, recruitment will not be conducted at all, but the applications will be accepted all the time.

2. Guardians are able to accompany children to and from the kindergarten.

Electronic application is accepted from November 11

If maximum enrollment is not reached after the drawing, the corresponding kindergartens will accept extra applications.

After December 2, applications will be accepted on December 9 at 2 p.m. at the kindergarten where an applicant wants to enroll.

National Pension System

All residents turning 20 must enroll in Japan's National Pension plan

Everyone living in Japan, including foreign residents, aged between 20 and 60 must enroll in the National Pension System. After enrolling, if you fulfill the necessary criteria you will receive the Basic Pension for the Elderly. If you were to become disabled due to an injury or illness, or you were to pass away, your spouse and/or children would receive the Basic Disability Pension or the Basic Survivors' Pension, respectively. If you are not a Japanese citizen and leave Japan without receiving a pension, you can claim a lumpsum withdrawal refund within two years after your departure if you have paid at least six months of the premium payment period.

Enrollment is unnecessary if you are:

- Enrolled in an employee pension plan
- A dependent spouse of a person enrolled in an employee pension plan
- A citizen of a country which has concluded a social security agreement with Japan and thus exempt from enrolling in Japan's National Pension plan
- Person with medical stay or long stay visa for sightseeing and recreation

Payment method / payment slips

Once you have submitted your notification of enrollment, the Pension Office sends you payment slips. Please make the payments at banks, convenience stores, or any other applicable locations.

Credit card and bank transfer payments are also acceptable. Premium discounts are available if you opt for advance lump-sum payment.

Additional Pension plan

In the Additional Pension Plan under the National Pension Plan, if you pay your monthly flat premium amount plus ¥400 per month, you will be eligible to receive additional benefits with your Basic Pension for the Elderly. The additional pension amount is calculated by multiplying ¥200 and the number of months that the additional premium was paid.

This amount will be added to your annual pension benefits. If you wish to enroll in additional pension insurance, you will need to make the necessary application.

Exemptions

The following systems are available for anyone having difficulties paying the premiums. Please inquire for more information.

- Exemption System full or partial payment exemption
- Contribution Postponement System for Low Income
- Special Deferral System for Students
- Pre and Post Childbirth Exemption System

HISTORICAL ARTIFACTS

Minato City Designated Cultural Assets 2022

Koto, Chess, Calligraphy, and Painting: Painting

A set of two folding screens in six panels, based on the traditional painting. The right screen shows a nobleman playing the *koto* and others listening, as well as a nobleman playing chess on a boat, while the left screen depicts noblemen engaged in calligraphy and painting. The characters are expressive and painted in great detail.





Wooden Seated Figures of Successive Generations of Priests: Sculpture

They are enshrined on the steps of *Zojoji's Sangedatsumon*. Feel the individual character of each priest, as shown by the varying facial expression and pose of each statue.



Early made domestic Grand Piano: Historical material

It was made by *Yamaha*Corporation and donated by the *Kujo* family, the home of the Empress of Emperor *Taisho* in 1930, used for a long time at the former *Hikawa* Elementary School. It is characterized by rich decorative features, including the music stand with its rounded curves. It holds great value to understand the early history of Western instruments in Japan.



Festival float dolls and accessories from the Akasaka Hikawa

Produced from the final days of the *Tokugawa* shogunate to the modern era, these are valuable historical materials for understanding the production background and structure of float dolls in *Edo Tokyo*. Many float dolls have been repaired in some form by later generations as they are used in festivals, but these items are believed to be in the same state as they were when they were first produced.
