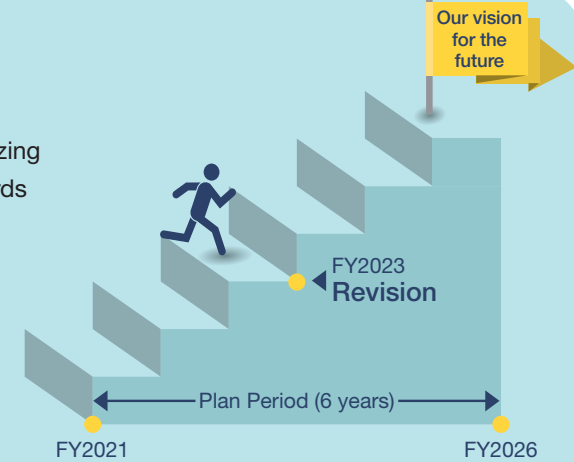

The Minato City Master Plan is a pathway to realizing our future vision of Minato City and a guide towards administration in the post-COVID age. The plan was revised in FY2023, during the six year period of the plan starting in FY2021 and ending in FY2026.

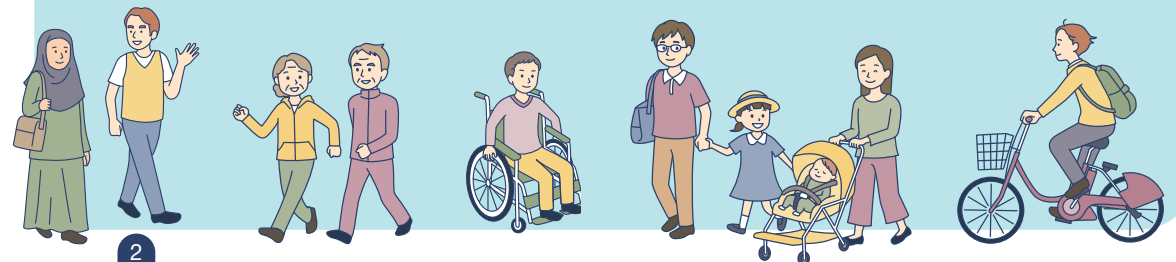

Revising the Master Plan

We joined hands and thought together with city residents to revise the plan.

We proactively created opportunities to hear the opinions of our residents through the Minato Town Forum community engagement forum, holding Citizens Awareness surveys and explanatory seminars. We incorporated these opinions into the Minato City Master Plan to the greatest possible extent. We will steadily carry out the plan built upon our citizens' opinions to create a more abundant lifestyle for the people of Minato City.

Minato Town Forum

A total of 71 workshops were held in which 79 residents, current employees, and current students participated in an exchange of opinions with city officials, and made a total of 269 recommendations across nine fields, including disaster prevention, to the mayor. The city incorporated these recommendations into the Master Plan to the greatest extent possible, and is steadily pursuing the various initiatives.

Children's Survey

In light of the enactment of the Basic Act on Children in April 2023, the city conducted a survey of children under 18 years old in order to proactively incorporate their opinions into the Master Plan. By understanding the vision children have for the future of Minato City, the city will carry out administration to a future abounding with hope.

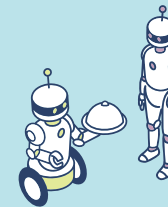

Priority matter 1

Creating a hopeful, dynamic city

Accelerate vigor in the city. Exceed the dynamism of the pre-COVID era.

Priority matter 2

Create a resilient city that protects the lives of residents from danger

Create a city that can overcome a variety of threats and dangers such as earthquakes, typhoons and infectious diseases.

Priority matter 3

Create a city of joyous children nurtured by the whole community

Create a society in which children can live with happiness. Create an environment that fosters children's growth.

Priority matter 4

Create a sustainable city that achieves both growth and low environmental impact

Create a vigorous city with greenery and water. An abundant city that contributes to achieving the SDGs.

Priority matter 5

Create a society of local co-existence in which a diverse range of people support each other.

Create a society where everyone can live naturally, regardless of age, disability, nationality or gender.

Priority matter 6

Accurately respond to administrative demands brought by population growth

I

A city that shines (urban planning, environment)



Together, create a city that is comfortable, convenient and appealing while also being safe and resilient to disaster and sustainable and environment friendly.



Improve disaster response measures against natural disasters such as earthquakes

Strengthen disaster response organization and measures, making pre-disaster preparations such as improving information transmission to prepare for natural disasters.



Advance decarbonization towards becoming a Zero Carbon City by 2050

Work towards becoming a Zero Carbon City as soon as possible by advancing decarbonization initiatives such the large-scale adoption of renewable energy and promoting energy-saving measures among city residents and businesses.

II

A dynamic city (community, industry)



Create a multi-cultural society of co-existence that embraces a diverse community and rich internationality.
Support city industry that fuses tradition with cutting-edge technology.



Promote community participation of foreign residents through opportunities such as Japanese language classes and cultural exchange

Promote the community participation and cooperation of foreign residents of Minato City by fostering understanding between foreign and Japanese city residents and supporting community exchange.



Create effective industry that fosters a local community of industry-academia-government collaboration.

Create dynamic local industry by promoting collaboration and exchange between stakeholders, start-ups gathering at the Industry Promotion Center and city SMEs.

The SDGs (Sustainable Development Goals) are a set of international goals adopted at the United Nations Summit for the year 2030, and consist of 17 goals to achieve a sustainable world. The Master Plan aligns city goals to the SDGs and promotes city administration that works towards the 17 goals.

III A city that nurtures people (welfare, health, education)



Support the education and growth of children.
Create an environment in which the community supports people living in their own style with opportunities to participate in sports and a variety of learning.



Enhance child-raising support services

Provide seamless support leveraging community resources to support child-raising households, multi-child households and households expecting multiple children.



Support a fulfilling and healthy lifestyle

Enhance support for elderly residents, advancing initiatives that promote awareness of community facilities and activities among elderly residents and foster their proactive participation in fulfilling and health-building activities.

IV Achieving the plan



Provide civil services of even greater convenience and quality leveraging cutting-edge technologies and unique Minato City administrative resources. Promote open, transparent civil administration that respects peace, human rights and diverse perspectives.



Promote digitization to create a more convenience lifestyle for city residents

Solve local challenges and provide convenient, stable administrative services by promoting the adoption of the latest digital technologies and digitization of administrative data.



Promote measures that leverage private sector strength

Create new added value for the private sector and strengthen the response to city challenges by promoting partnership between the private sector and the designated administrators of public facilities.

Regional Master plans

Solve local challenges in the each region to make the community even more appealing.

Minato City has five highly-unique districts: Shiba, Azabu, Akasaka, Takanawa and Shibaura-konan.

Building upon the participation and collaboration fostered in each district and the strong foundation of trust, district resources and private sector strength, the district will come together to carry out administrative policy.

The Regional Master Plans are plans formulated by each district for independent action. The plans are created based upon recommendations from resident participation forums. Each regional city office will share the plan with its residents and work towards its goals in collaboration.

The Akasaka Regional City Office will work towards creating a welcoming community that involves people of many positions and ages involved in the Akasaka district to promote interest and love for the community.

Takanawa Regional Master Plan

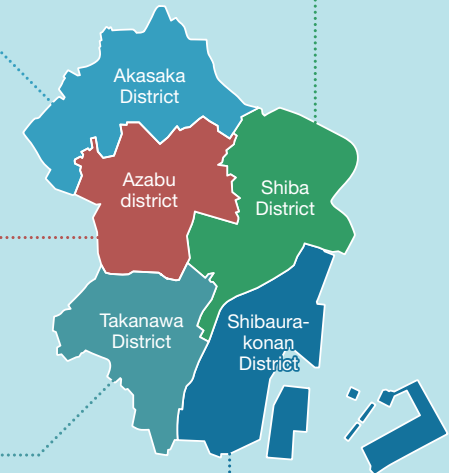
Creating safety and peace of mind through the circle of community
